Start of term

At the start of this new term I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of your commitment to supporting school by ensuring that you uphold the following:-

- Uniform –All children should be wearing their **full winter uniform, including their school hat or cap.**Children should be wearing the regulation navy blue coat for both boys and girls. Children should also be wearing regulation school scarves and gloves in navy blue. All uniform must be clearly labelled.
- Timekeeping All children **must** arrive in school before 8.25 a.m. when the register is taken and the day begins with a prayer. Lessons start promptly at 8.30 a.m. For safety and security reasons, the doors are locked after the children are in the building. Latecomers, after 8:30 a.m. must be brought into the school building by their parents who **must report to the school office and sign your child in.** This is to make sure that the children's names are added to the attendance registers. It ensures that all children present in the building are in the register for a roll call in case of a fire or another emergency.
- Homework It is the responsibility of all parents to check that their child's daily homework is completed to a high standard! Home learning is linked to learning in the classroom and is used for reinforcement and consolidation. Please encourage your child to attempt all homework and let the class teacher know of any difficulties. The homework diary can be used as an effective means of communication.
- Sickness I would like to remind parents that children **must not** be brought to school if they have a temperature or are complaining of feeling poorly either sick or with headaches. We ask you to remind the children of the importance of personal hygiene in containing germs. If your child has sickness/diarrhoea can you please keep them at home for a minimum of 48 hours. If your child is sick you must phone the school absence line. Thank you.

After School Clubs and Homework Club

Homework club begins today, Tuesday 7th January and all after school clubs including sports begin on Monday 13th January. Please register your child for any clubs as soon as possible via Parentmail. Thank you.
